This beautiful park is named in honor of Dr. and Mrs. C.C. Wannamaker, who were extremely dedicated to North Charleston and the people of Charleston County.


Mrs. Betty Wannamaker served on the Charleston County Park and Recreation Commission for nineteen years. During her tenure, she was instrumental in the continued development of the county park system for all citizens of Charleston County to enjoy as well as the preservation of land for future generations.

The land that now houses this park is part of the historic Elms Plantation which was owned by the Izard family. The Izards moved into the area in the late seventeenth century. From the 1690's until 1831, five members of the family owned the plantation. In 1994, the Charleston County Park and Recreation Commission purchased the property.

Wannamaker County Park offers over 1015 acres of beautiful woodlands and wetlands bordered by the Goose Creek Reservoir to the north. Miles of paved trails and unpaved nature trails allow for exploration of the park's beautiful natural resources. Picnic sites with grills are scattered throughout the site.

The Park Center, with its freshwater lagoon, provides a central location for pedal boating, bicycling and fishing. The popular Sprinkler is a great place to cool off during the hot summer months. This chlorinated spray geyser system is for kids of all ages to enjoy. This area is open seasonally during park hours at no additional fee. Restrooms are located nearby for changing. Kids of all ages find the mighty Play Hill and the playground area to be one of their favorite spots in this park. A number of shady picnic sites equipped with grills and tables may be found adjacent to the play equipment.

The Jump Castle area is conveniently located between the Snack Bar and Play Hill. During a four hour picnic rental, two hours of jump time are provided. Groups up to 25 may use this area.

The Dog Park is a great place to play with your four-legged friend and meet fellow dog owners.

Every May through Labor Day, enjoy Whirlin' Waters Adventure Waterpark at Wannamaker. This exciting addition promises all the thrills and spills of a large scale island-style water facility. The entire family will enjoy a full day of fun!

North Charleston Wannamaker Park Guidelines

1. Alcoholic beverages are only allowed in designated areas with an approved application.
2. Radios must be kept at low volume.
3. Fires allowed in cooking grills only.
4. Removal or destruction of natural resources and wildlife is prohibited.
5. Metal detectors are not allowed.
6. No swimming allowed in lakes, lagoons, ponds or tidal creeks.
7. Pets must be kept on a leash (except in designated off-leash areas), cleaned up after, and under control at all times.
8. Motorized vehicles permitted on designated roadways only.
9. Please stay on marked trails and paths.
10. Firearms, fireworks, remote control airplanes, and any dangerous projectiles are prohibited. Charleston County Park & Recreation Commission does recognize a valid South Carolina Concealed Weapons Permit.
11. No bicycles, skates, rollerblades or skateboards allowed on docks or hill. Please walk bicycles on boardwalks and ramps.
12. Freshwater fishing is offered in some areas of the park.
13. All occupants of any kayak or boat must wear a personal flotation device at all times while on any lake, lagoon or pond.
14. Activities involving sales and solicitation require written approval from park management.

Sprinkler

1. Adult supervision required.
2. No bicycles, rollerblades, skates, skateboards, pets or toys.
3. No food or drinks.
4. No running.
5. Area may be closed periodically for inclement weather or maintenance.
